

## English Language Proficiency Exemption List

International Applicants are exempt from submitting English Proficiency test scores if they have:

- Successful completion of a minimum of two years of full-time study in a school and country where English is the primary language
- Successful completion of a minimum of one year of full-time study at the postsecondary level in an institution and country where English is the primary language
- Successful completion of Seneca’s English Language Institute
- International students who obtain an International Baccalaureate in English from one of the International Schools' members of the Council of International Schools ([www.cois.org](http://www.cois.org)).
